MONTEREY COUNTY VETERAN'S COLLABORATIVE meets monthly to bring groups together that support veterans. This group was founded approx. 18 years ago when a local veteran attended a Monterey County Mental Health Commission meeting and complained of no services being available for veterans. Alma was a Mental Health Commissioner at the time and is a founding member of the Collaborative. She and Charles attend the monthly meetings as representatives of the Monterey Elks Lodge to the Monterey County Veteran's Collaborative. LENDING LIBRARY: We started the children's "Lending Library" in November 2022. This month the Veterans Subcommittee picked up and delivered donations of artwork, children and adult clothing, dishes, cookware, and linens.

MONTEREY COUNTY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH COMMISSION is comprised of both mental health services and drug and alcohol services. Charles and Alma continue to attend the monthly meetings as representatives of the Elks. This month the Drug Awareness Subcommittee continued to provide books for the children remaining at Pueblo Del Mar (PDM). The subcommittee will again be asking for funding to support the children at PDM for the Christmas holidays. Currently there are 15 children at PDM, ages birth to 18 years old. CALIFORNIA-HAWAII ELKS ASSOCIATION MID-TERM CONVENTION

Have you ever wondered how your Officers get their information managing your lodge? How updates from Grand Lodge filter down, or just been more curious about Elkdom? Well, the answer is **MID-TERM CONVENTION**! Elks have two Conventions and one Homecoming each year where California-Hawaii Elks Association (CHEA) business is conducted.

Here is a summary of what happens at each. All members of the B.P.O.E. are encouraged to attend and there are four Officers that are required to attend - ER, Secretary, Leading Knight, and Chairman of the Trustees.

- State Convention held in May Committees present their reports for the previous year, the new CHEA President and other CHEA Officers are installed
- Mid-term Convention held the first weekend in November This is where all the education sessions are conducted. Usually done in two separate groups - one for the Lodge Fraternal aspects and one for the Lodge Management. They also have CHEA Committee breakout sessions after the main session.
- Homecoming specifically for the CHEA President final visit to his home District. CHEA State committees meet, as well as decisions made on the Committee Chairpersons, Vice Presidents, and District Deputies for the next year.




